

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF
PETROLEUM IMPORTATION LICENCE for Liquid
fuels (PMS, DIESEL, JET & HFO)**

1. Importer must be a registered Gambian Company
2. Importer must obtain Tax Clearance from the Gambia Revenue Authority (GRA) indicating that it has no tax arrears.
3. Importer must submit at least twelve months of import plan.
4. All discharge of imports of Diesel, Petrol, Kerosene and Jet fuel will be centralized at the Mandinari depot for stock monitoring, quality assessment, GRA control. It should be noted that Government is a shareholder of the bonded Mandinari facility and its full utilization by all licensed importers will be assured. Any other discharge facility must be an approved bonded facility that meets all the requirements that will ensure quality check, stock monitoring and GRA control.
5. The entry point for all imports of liquid petroleum products, stated above, will be the sea-port of Banjul except under authorized emergency situation. Even in the event of an emergency situation where imports are by land, the product

must be discharged in Mandinari or other approved bonded facility.

6. All imported petroleum products must be certified by an internationally recognize Agency for quality purposes.
7. Licensed importers will be required to provide monthly reports on the status of their orders.
8. Similarly, any licence holder reserves the right to give-up their licence with at least three (3) months notice.
9. Licence will be issued for a term of five (5) years subject to annual review
10. The Licence fee for Liquid products (as stated above is) D250,000 and shall be paid annually to the GRA.
